



In 2016 the Northwest Division will once again contest the Land of the Leaders ET Challenge. The series allows racers from each track to compete against racers from other member tracks from across the Northwest Division for a year end championship. Points for the series are earned at 4 events selected by the participating track. Racers competing in the Series must have a current NHRA Competition number and Membership. Champions will be crowned in Super Pro, Pro, Sportsman, Bike/ Snowmobile, Junior Dragster-Storm, Junior Dragster-Thunder, and Junior Dragster-Lightning. Champions will receive a Wally and Champions Jacket.

Program Guidelines

- Four race series to be held at each member track on dates specified by the member track (see attached page) held between March 1 and October 31, 2016.
- Dates must be submitted to the Northwest Division office no later than March 1, 2016 (see attached page).
- Series dates must be concluded by October 31, 2016.
- Race results (Round results to verify car count, rounds won, and issue points) must be sent (by mail, email or fax) to the Northwest Division office within two (2) weeks of completion of event with all results due no later than November 1, 2016.
- Seven (7) classes of competition – Super Pro, Pro, Sportsman, Bike/Sled, Jr Lightning, Jr Thunder and Jr Storm.
- Racer must be signed up for track points program and have a current NHRA Competition Number in the ET category for Super Pro, Pro, and Sportsman. Racer must have a current NHRA Competition Number in the ETMX or SM category for Bike/Sled. Racer must have current NHRA Competition Number in JDRL.
- Racer may compete in this program at more than one member track, but points will be awarded per track.
- Points will be awarded by the Northwest Division office as follows:

- If a tie exists for the Championship at the conclusion of the season, the following tiebreaker procedures will be followed until tie is broken.
 - 1) Driver with most Land Of Leaders Challenge Event wins, wins tie.
 - 2) Driver with most rounds won (at Land Of Leaders Challenge Events) wins tie (including rounds where no points were awarded. Example - 2nd round loss in a 5 round race).
 - 3) Driver going the furthest number of rounds in their respective tracks final Challenge Series race wins tie.

If in the rare event the tie is not broken between the respective tied drivers following the tiebreak procedures, each of the tied drivers will receive Champion honors.
